

Economics courses for Visiting Students at LMH

Prerequisites

Applicants for our Economics programme for Visiting Students must have completed the following courses before arrival in Oxford. If any of these courses has not been completed when the application is submitted, evidence must be provided that it will be completed before arrival and referees must comment on the applicant's expected attainment in that course.

- Intermediate Microeconomics
- Intermediate Macroeconomics
- Calculus up to and including Multivariable Calculus

Please note that there are additional prerequisites for one of the Michaelmas Term optional courses; see table below.

Course Structure

The Oxford academic year is split into three terms (Michaelmas term – October to December, Hilary term – January to March, and Trinity term – April to June). In each term Economics visiting students take one compulsory core course and one course chosen from a list of options. The structure of our Economics programme for Visiting Students is summarised here:

Students in this position will take two optional courses in Trinity Term</p> <p>*** The Extended Essay is an opportunity for independent in-depth work on a topic of the student's choosing, subject to suitable supervision being available.</p>
