If you can't join us in person in Oxford, an LMH Oxford Summer Programme Online presents an alternate opportunity to experience Oxford's world-renowned tutorial teaching system, and gain new skills to take you further in your future academic or professional career.

Meaningful learning requires easy interaction and shared participation. Lady Margaret Hall's remote programme platform ensures that this is never lost. You will use the app to register with the programme, access materials, watch live or recorded lectures, and ask questions of speakers in real time. For seminar and tutorial classes you and other students taking part online from around the world will join a tutor in Oxford in a virtual classroom.

Through careful online classroom management sessions are as interactive and engaging as if you were in the same room.

Throughout the programme our Remote Learning Coordinators will be on hand to ensure that online students are able to take part fully and effectively with all aspects of the academic programme.

You can choose to take courses in the same subject stream, or you can select courses from different disciplines to create your own personalised programme. You may also consider joining a residential course followed by an online one or vice versa, which will allow you to have both authentic Oxford experience and the convenience of learning remotely.
