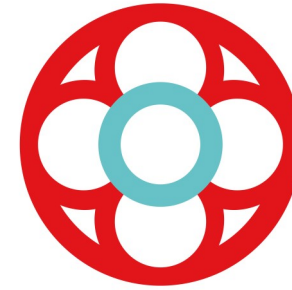

Friday 14th Oct

Friday 21st Oct

Dr Elizabeth Joy. Elizabeth is the Director at Churches Together in England. She has a PhD in Theology from King's College London and has served on the World Council of Churches for many years and as Executive Secretary for Mission Education at the Council for World Mission. She is a former Chief Executive of the Student Christian Movement of India.

Friday 28th Oct

The Revd Stephen O'Connor. Prior to ordination Steve worked as a cancer and palliative care nurse, in both academic and clinical roles. He lectured at Canterbury Christ Church University in palliative care and has published numerous books and articles. He is currently Associate Priest at St Giles Church, here in Oxford.

Friday 4th Nov—All Souls

The Revd Mae Christi. Mae is Vicar of All Saints Church, Tooting, London and was previously Curate of St Christopher's Church and Pembroke House in Waltham. Her interests include social justice, music, sports, politics, cooking and traveling. She grew up in the Deep South of the United States, where scripture and prayer were embedded into her family, life and culture in numerous ways and her own study of the

Friday 11th Nov—Remembrance

The Rev Dr Mel Marshall. Mel was a popular Chaplain at Lincoln college before becoming the first female Associate Chaplain at Merton. She is a theologian and describes herself as 'old-fashioned Anglo-Catholic with firm liturgical and theological convictions'

Friday 18th Nov

The Revd Steffan Matthias. Steffan is a Vicar in Streatham, South London. Before ministry, his PhD was in Biblical Studies, focusing on the Old Testament and questions about beliefs and practices about death and afterlife. Alongside ministry, he teaches bible in a range of contexts to lay and ordained people.

Friday 25th Nov

The Revd Charlie Bell. Charlie Bell is a priest of the diocese of Southwark and also a practicing psychiatrist in South London. His academic life is split between London and Cambridge, where he is a Fellow at Girton College. His theological interests are in the refining and interrogation of doctrine in the context of science and human discovery - he has written on this in the context of sexuality and is currently completing a book on death, dying and despair. He is particularly interested in the way scripture is used in the development of theological motif, the relationship of scripture to narrative, and the importance of contextual understandings of the formation and reading of scripture in the life of the church.
