

Medical Registration

All new students are asked to register with **Banbury Road Medical Centre**. Banbury Road Medical Centre is just a 10-minute walk away from the College. For the convenience of students, a doctor from Banbury Road Medical Centre offers appointments in the College during term time.

Being registered with a College doctor will make it easier to see a doctor quickly in Oxford should you need to. Furthermore, a medical certificate from a College doctor is required in the case of students whose examinations and assessments are affected by illness or where students need certain health/medical-related adjustments for examinations and assessments.

UK Mobile Telephone number: If you have a UK mobile phone number, please enter this (if not, please leave this field blank). **International students are strongly advised to obtain a UK SIM card after arrival in Oxford, since it is not possible to access and use medical services without a UK phone number.**

Health advice from the College Nurse

Before you come to University there are a few simple steps you can take to promote your health:

- Make sure your immunisations are up to date and, if necessary, ask your current doctor to schedule outstanding immunisations. If you need to start a course of immunisations, please start this process with your current doctor and the rest of the course can be completed when you have moved into College.
- If you take any medications regularly, update your prescriptions. This will give you time to settle in to College before you need to sort out renewing your prescriptions again.
- Bring a thermometer and 'over the counter' remedies for common ailments (e.g. colds, stomach upsets). It is good to be prepared for minor illnesses as LMH does not have a pharmacy in the immediate area.

Additional advice for International Students and Visiting Students

International students who have a Student Visa are entitled to treatment free of charge on the National Health Service (NHS) and **must register with the Medical Centre in order to access care when required**. Please be aware that this is not private healthcare, and there is often a few days' wait for an appointment. **International students are strongly advised to obtain a UK SIM card after arrival in Oxford, since it is not possible to access and use medical services without a UK phone number.**

It's important to be aware that you may not be permitted to bring home remedies by air and therefore should seek advice from the College Nurse when you arrive.
